Prof. Konrad Osajda, PhD Hab., LLM, M.A. (in Law) is a professor at the Faculty of Law and Administration (University of Warsaw) and he works for Supreme Court since 2007 (currently as a full member of Studies and Analyzes Office). He graduated summa cum laude at Warsaw University in 2004. Then he obtained a Master of Laws degree at the Ottawa University (2006) and, subsequently doctorate in law (PhD) in 2008 at Warsaw University. Finally, he submitted his habilitation theses in 2014 and was granted habilitation in 2015. Later he was granted the professor title by the President of the Republic of Poland (2021). He also became a Member of Polish Academy of Sciences.

He does research and teaches in corporate law, commercial law, contracts, and succession law (last wills and testaments). He is a member of the Council of Curators of Polish Academy of Sciences (since 2019 the Council's Vice-Chairman), an honorary fellow of Asian Institute of International Financial Law in Hong Kong, he was president of the Young Academy of Polish Academy of Sciences and Member of the Committee of Legal Sciences of Polish Academy of Sciences (he also acted as the Committee's scientific secretary).

He received plenty of awards and scholarships, including Konrad Zweigert scholarship (two times) granted by the Max-Planck-Institut für ausländisches und internationales Privatrecht in Hamburg (for junior and senior scholar respectively), the scholarship START granted by the Foundation for Polish Science (twice), the scholarship for an outstanding young scholar granted by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education (twice), scholarship Edward Barry McDougall Memorial. His monograph on the liability of directors in case of insolvency was recognized as the best commercial and corporate law thesis published in Poland in a given year. He spent time doing research abroad (inter alia in Hamburg and Saarbrücken).

He also was invited and taught as a visiting professor at different universities worldwide, including Hong Kong University, Ottawa University, Tel Aviv University, Université de Montréal, Vienna University, and Kyiv University, He presented papers during many national and international conferences, including conferences in Beijing, Dubai, Vancouver, Victoria, and Kyiv. He published more than 150 books and papers. He is also editor-in-chief of the Great Commentary to Polish Private Law.
